Stillwater Community Action Team & The Vial of Life By Joanna Phillips, RN

The SCAT (Stillwater Community Action Team) was formed about 3 years ago, and consists of the hospital case management department, area nursing homes, home health providers, hospice providers, EMS, assisted living, durable medical equipment providers, and other entities that are involved with transition of patient care to make it as safe as possible. The members of the team work together to provide patient needs, and to reduce patient readmissions.

The Vial of Life was created as a resource the patient could have on hand, at home, which could be easily transported from one level of care to the other. It contains valuable patient history, medication list, and other pertinent information. The vial includes a patient information form, a refrigerator magnet to notify EMS and family that the vial is readily available, and a label on the vial. Garden Egg Salad Courtesy of Food Network Kitchen



Ingredients:

6 large eggs

½ cup low-fat mayonnaise

- 2 tablespoons whole-grain mustard Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 2 scallions (white and green), thinly sliced
- 1 rib celery, minced, scant ½ cup
- 2 radishes, grated on the large holes of a box grater
- 8 romaine lettuce leaves
- 1 cup pea or other sprouts

Instructions:

- 1. Put the eggs in a saucepan with enough cold water to cover. Bring to a boil, cover, and remove from the heat. Set aside for 12 minutes. Drain the eggs and roll them between your palm and the counter to crack the shell, then peel under cool running water.
- **2.** Dice the eggs. Combine the eggs with mayonnaise, mustard and season with the salt and pepper. Stir in the scallions, celery, and radish.
- **3.** Divide the egg salad among the lettuce leaves, top with the sprouts and roll up. Serve 2 rolls per serving.





Oklahoma Advance Directive for Home Care

The Advance Directive for Health Care, also known as a "Living Will", is a legal document that gives directions to healthcare providers regarding your wishes concerning life-sustaining medical care. The form allows you to state your wishes regarding ventilators, feeding tubes, surgery and drugs to prolong your life, and to name a healthcare proxy who will speak on your behalf. Every adult should complete an Advance Directive.

It is impossible to predict when someone could have an accident or sudden illness and become unable to communicate their own healthcare wishes. The Advance Directive ensures that your wishes are followed if you are incapacitated. The Advance Directive requires signatures of two witnesses, but it does not require a notary to be legal. You should make several copies and have one on file with your doctor(s) and close family members; it should be easily accessible in the case of emergency. The Advance Directive can be revoked at any time and should be reviewed every few years to ensure it still reflects your wishes.
