Lincoln Lemieux Caps U.S. Air Force National With Podium In New York

Aurora, Minn. (February 8, 2016) The AMSOIL Championship Snocross series returned to action over the weekend in western New York, home to some of the most avid fans on the national tour. Salamanca is always a favorite stop for the team for multiple reasons. The region is about as close to home as we get for all three of our riders and the events and festivities that coincide with this being a U.S. Air Force sponsored race make it even more special.

Tim Tremblay made a charge during Friday night's Pro Open final, racing among the early leaders before finishing fourth overall. Tremblay is continuing to rebound from a holiday practice crash that has him searching for the consistency he displayed to start the season. "I just haven't been the same since Christmas," said Tremblay. My speed is good and the team has been working really hard to make the sled better every week but it is just taking a little longer to recover each night. We are doing okay in the championship but I want to win races."

Lincoln Lemieux was the top qualifier on Friday finishing 1-1 in heat races and was battling for a podium position early when he tangled with another racer and came off his machine. Lemieux rebounded for a 10th place but was happy with his speed.

On Saturday, Lemieux, who again qualified well, grabbed a great start to begin the main event and separated from the field as he went on to a second place podium finish. Tremblay would complete the final in seventh position but retained the number two spot in the coveted Pro Open championship.

Pro Lite racer Max Taillefer was holding down a podium position late in Friday's final when his machine swapped after landing on a high-speed portion of the track. Taillefer was able to remount and sixth place.

After the event on Saturday night, the team hosted guest rides with our visitors from the U.S. Air Force, including Major General Garret Harencak, a 33 year veteran who has flown everything from B-52s to B-1B bombers.
