Recently, she has published several articles in peer reviewed journals; one on standing (BMJ, 2016), four on gait trainers (Clin Rehan 2015) and one on wheeled mobility. She became certified in 2014 for General Movement Assessment, a tool which has a 92-98% success rate at identifying which 2-5 month old infants will have cerebral palsy.
